

Paul G. Gorman, Ed.D., is President and CEO of West Central Behavioral Health, a community mental health center associated with the Dartmouth-Hitchcock Alliance. West Central Behavioral Health provides services to children, families, adults, and elders in western New Hampshire. Dr. Gorman is also an Adjunct Assistant Professor with the Dartmouth College Medical School's Department of Psychiatry. From 2001-2005, he served as Director of the West Institute at the New Hampshire – Dartmouth Psychiatric Research Center, which developed the educational modules and training implementation strategies for the national project in evidence-based practices (EBPs) for treatment for people with several mental illnesses.

From 1996 -2001, Dr. Gorman was Director of the New Hampshire Division of Behavioral Health, where he was responsible for administering the state's public mental health system. This included development and review of the state's contracts with 10 regional community mental health centers across the state and oversight of New Hampshire's psychiatric hospital and nursing facility for people with mental illness and/or developmental disability.

Dr. Gorman served as a member of the President's New Freedom Commission's National Acute Care Task Force. He also served as Special Monitor of Hawaii Sate Hospital under order of the Federal District Court in Hawaii (2001-2006) and as a consultant to the states of Alaska, Tennessee, and Massachusetts. Dr. Gorman received Ed.D. degrees from Pacific State University and Boston State College.
