Mr. Mason is a legislative attorney in the Courts and International Law Section in the CRS American Law Division. His areas of specialty include military and defense law, ranging from operational issues, including Law of Armed Conflict, Law of the Sea, and Status of Forces Agreements (SOFAs); domestic issues, including Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC), military real property transfers, and posse comitatus (i.e., prohibitions on the use of the military for domestic law enforcement); and military personnel issues, including the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA), military courts-martial, and the Uniform Services Former Spouse Protection Act (USFSPA).

Prior to joining CRS, Mr. Mason served for 5 years as a Judge Advocate in the United States Navy JAG Corps. He completed deployments to the Arabian Gulf as the Staff Judge Advocate for two Expeditionary Strike Groups in support of the Global War on Terrorism. He also served as defense counsel on numerous Special and General Courts-Martial.
