The state of Oregon, in partnership with the National Governors Association Center for Best Practices (NGA Center), is hosting a retreat on policies and strategies to improve energy resilience. Based on opportunities identified in the NGA Center's *State Resilience Assessment and Planning Tool*, the objectives of this retreat are to assist Oregon leadership in identifying actions that will improve the state's resilience in the event of a prolonged outage of the electric grid. At the end of the retreat, participants will have:

- Learned about current state resilience plans, such as the Cascadia Playbook and Oregon Fuel Action Plan:
- Discussed opportunities to improve resilience for future energy emergencies;
- Identified solutions to improve fuel security for critical, lifeline assets and electricity response and restoration efforts;
- Explored solutions for continuity of governance (COG) and continuity of operations planning (COOP) for state government during energy emergencies; and
- Developed potential recommendations for future actions the governor can pursue.
