# Criteria for Inclusion in NGA's Governors' Biographical Database

- For the original thirteen states and commonwealths, all those who served as governor
  or acting governor from the date the Declaration of Independence was adopted,
  including military governors serving during the Civil War.
- For the other thirty-seven states, governors and acting governors who served from the date statehood was granted, including military governors serving during the Civil War.
- 3. For current territories and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, all elected governors.

In some cases, states were carved from more than one territory, while in other instances a single territory may have been divided into more than one state. Therefore, territorial governors have *not* been included in what is a state-by-state biographical database.
