GUEST SPEAKER: Paul Fennewald, National School Safety Alliance



Paul H. Fennewald currently serves as a Senior Policy Advisor for the Missouri Center for Education Safety. He previously served as it's Director from 2012 through 2016. Prior to that, Paul served as Missouri's Homeland Security Coordinator from 2005 to 2012. Paul also founded and serves as the Administrator of the National School Safety Alliance (NSSA), an affiliation of State School Safety Center Directors as well as the top "point of contact" for school safety in states that do not have a formal designated school safety center. Paul moderates a monthly collaboration meeting of the group via a conference call and via a DHS HSIN virtual meeting room.

Paul spent 23 years as a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation from 1981 to 200. He spent most of those 23 years working terrorism related investigations, as well as responding to a number of major terrorist attacks, including the bombing of the USS Cole, the Nairobi, Kenya USS Embassy bombing, and the 9/11/2001 World Trade Center attack.







