States Fully Funding Education



K-12 Funding: State Examples



Georgia Gov. Brian Kemp proposed increasing funding for education by \$425 million in the 2023 budget to fully fund schools and to remove austerity cuts from the pandemic.



K-12 Funding: State Examples



Nevada Gov. Steve Sisolak highlighted that the state has raised per pupil funding to a new high.

Florida Gov. Ron **DeSantis** praised the state for adding over 50 new apprenticeship programs over the last three years.

Maine Gov. Janet Mills discussed efforts to expand career and technical education programs so that children can be taught earlier.

Increased Educator Pay Recruiting a Diverse and Qualified Teacher Workforce



Teacher Staffing: State Examples



New Mexico Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham proposed a pay increase of at least 7% for every educator in the state. This change would make NM the first state in the region for average educator pay.



Teacher Staffing: State Examples



Iowa Gov. Kim Reynolds announced a teacher registered apprenticeship program that would enable high school students to earn a paraeducator credential and associate degree in high school. The experience counts as credit toward student teaching.

Kentucky Gov. Andy Beshear praised the Coverings for Kids Initiative for providing PPE to students in schools.

U.S. Virgin Islands Gov. Albert Bryan Jr. noted \$13 million in P-EBT payments for children's nutrition benefits.



Physical & Mental Health: State Examples



Alabama Gov. Kay Ivey noted state efforts to provide resources for schoolbased mental health care.

Wisconsin Gov. Tony Evers announced the Get Kids Ahead Initiative, providing \$15 million for mental health services in schools.

Postsecondary Affordability: State Examples



Colorado Gov. Jared Polis proposed stronger support of postsecondary institutions to keep tuition flat.

New Jersey Gov. Phil Murphy made in-state tuition payments and investments in college savings plans taxdeductible.

Illinois Gov. J.B. Pritzker proposed new investments in nursing scholarships and loan forgiveness programs.



North Dakota Gov. Doug Burgum fully funded the National Guard Tuition Assistance Program.
